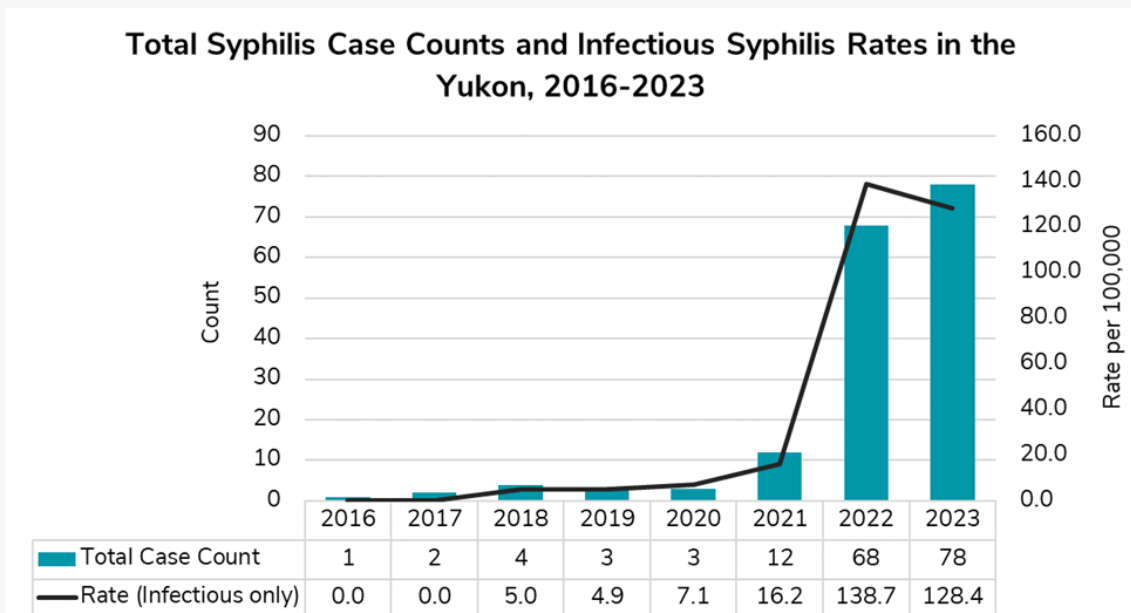


Syphilis is widespread in the Yukon and on the rise.

146 infections since Jan 1, 2022



Case counts include all cases of syphilis (infectious, non-infectious, congenital, and unspecified duration), whereas the rate is calculated using infectious counts only. Data is current as of January 1, 2024.

In 2023, rates of infectious syphilis were over 26 times higher than rates in 2019.

Most people infected are **20-39 years old**

In 2023:

54% of syphilis cases in the Yukon were in **women**.

46% of syphilis cases in the Yukon were in **men**.
