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Circumstances of Death

Ms. Robertson was an experienced horse rider. On July 3, 2014, Ms. Robertson and her horse, were at a saddle fitting clinic at a local riding arena. A saddle was put on the horse and Ms. Robertson was riding to test the fit. The horse suddenly bolted and started bucking. Ms. Robertson was unseated and landed on the hard packed dirt floor of the riding arena. Ms. Robertson was wearing a riding helmet at the time of the accident.

Ms. Robertson was immediately knocked unconscious and was not breathing. She started breathing again on her own, although her breathing was labored. Emergency Medical Services was notified and departed for the scene at 12:53hrs. The ambulance arrived on scene at 13:12hrs.

Ms. Robertson was transferred by air medevac to Vancouver General Hospital for significant traumatic brain injury. Ms. Robertson remained in the Intensive Care Unit at Vancouver General Hospital for three weeks. She was repatriated back to Whitehorse General Hospital with a palliative care direction. Ms. Robertson died of her injuries on August 19, 2014.

Significant Factors/Conclusions

Ms. Robertson was wearing a helmet at the time of the accident. She was was an experienced horse rider, who was familiar with the horse she was riding.

Despite wearing a helmet, Ms. Robertson sustained serious, unrecoverable, traumatic brain injury when she was unseated from the horse and landed on the ground.
