



Aboriginal Day Survey Results Summary

Effects of a statutory holiday on business operations and viability (employers and members of the business community only):




Comments:

Nearly half (49%) of the responding employers and/or members of the business communities felt they would not be affected, or would be affected only slightly.


Over one-quarter (27%) of the responding employers and/or members of the business communities noted that businesses would be **negatively affected**.

One-fifth (20%) of the responding employers and/or members of the business communities thought businesses would be **positively affected**.

Specific benefits to making National Aboriginal Day a statutory holiday:




Implications:

The primary negative implication was identified as government or business payroll costs, (42%) followed by government office or business closure (3%).

The primary positive implication was increased revenue and spending (e.g. tourism) (34%).
