The Moosehide Slide (Ĕdhä dädhëchą) is one of the most iconic natural features of the Yukon. For the Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in it marked arrival to their fishing grounds and the coming together of families following winter travels. For gold seekers it signalled their arrival into the Klondike. Today, it is a connection to place for people who live in Dawson City.

The story of the creation of the Moosehide slide is a “long-ago” story demonstrating Tr'ondëk Hwëch'in's enduring relationship with their landscape.
