





International overnight visitation (1+ nights)


YTD overnight visitation was 29% lower than the 5-year average (2017-2021).

Q3 overnight visitation for international visitors was 240% higher than the same period in 2021.

YTD overnight visitation was 217% higher than the same period in 2021.

Air arrivals at Erik Nielsen Whitehorse International Airport


YTD airport arrivals were 5% higher than the 5-year average (2017-2021).


Occupancy at select fixed roof accommodations

YTD occupancy rate was 17 percentage points higher than the same period in 2021.

Q3 occupancy rate was 20 percentage points higher than the same period in 2021.

In the first nine months of 2022, Yukon's occupancy rate was 4 percentage points lower than the national occupancy rate (61%).

Figures represent approximately 600 rooms in Yukon and should not be generalized to the whole accommodation market. Figures are presented as an indicator only.



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


Q3 border crossings were 503% higher than in 2021 but still 45% lower than the YTD 5-year average (2017-2021).


Same day international border crossings (into Yukon)

YTD same day border crossings were 992% higher than in 2021 but still 69% lower than the YTD 5year average(2017-2021).

Q3 same day border crossings were 1033% higher as compared to the same period in 2021.

Occupancy rate at short-term rental industry (in Yukon)

For the entire home, YTD occupancy rate was 0.9 percentage points higher than the same period in 2021 and 4.8 percentage points higher than the YTD 5-year average (2017-2021). Q3 occupancy rate was 2.2 percentage points higher than the same period in 2021.

For room only, YTD occupancy rate was 0.3 percentage points lower than the same period in 2021 and 4.1 percentage points higher than the YTD 5-year average (2017-2021). Q3 occupancy rate was 1.8 percentage points higher than the same period in 2021.
