

Yukon Tourism Visitation Report Jan-Sept 2023



Year-to-date vs. 5-year average

International overnight visitation (1+ nights)

- Q3 overnight visitation for international visitors was 18% higher than the same period in 2022.
- YTD overnight visitation was 22% higher than the same period in 2022 and 27% lower than in 2019.
- YTD overnight visitation was 5% higher than the 5-year average (2018-2022).

Air arrivals at Erik Nielsen Whitehorse International Airport

- Q3 air arrivals stood at 58,921 which is an increase of 19% compared to the same period in 2022.
- YTD airport arrivals were 26% higher than the same period in 2022 and 12% lower than in 2019.
- YTD airport arrivals were 41% higher than the 5-year average (2018-2022).




Occupancy at select fixed roof accommodations


- Q3 occupancy rate was 8 percentage points higher than the same period in 2022.
- YTD occupancy rate was 10 percentage points higher than the same period in 2022 which is only 0.2 percentage points lower than in 2019.
- YTD occupancy rate for the Q3 of 2023 was 13 percentage points higher than the five-year average (2018 to 2022).

International border crossings (into the Yukon)

- In Q3 2023, the international border crossings reached 273,952 which is a 171% increase from the 101,262 border crossings in Q3 2022.
- YTD international border crossings were 177% higher as compared to the same period in 2022 and 10% lower than in 2019.
- YTD international border crossings for Q3 2023 were 85% higher than the five-year average(2018 to 2022).


Same-day international border crossings (into the Yukon)


- In Q3 2023, the total number of sameday border crossings was 171,251 which is a 490% increase from the 29,010 crossings in Q3 2022.
- YTD same-day border crossings were 501% higher as compared to the same period last year and 4% lower than in 2019.
- YTD same-day border crossings for the Q2 of 2023 was 137% higher than the five-year average (2018 to 2022).

Occupancy rate at short-term rental sector (in the Yukon)

- For the entire home, Q3 occupancy rate was 1 percentage point higher than the same period in 2022. YTD occupancy rate was 2 percentage points higher than the same period in 2022 and 3 percentage points above the five-year average(2018 to 2022).
- For rooms only, Q3 occupancy rate was 2 percentage points higher than the same period in 2022. YTD occupancy rate was 2 percentage points lower than the same period in 2022 and 3 percentage point above the five-year average(2018 to 2022).
