## **Building Permits, October 2020 (preliminary)**

Released by Statistics Canada - November 30, 2020

In October 2020, the preliminary seasonally adjusted value of building permits (\$11.7 million) in Yukon decreased by \$20.8 million, or 64.0%, compared to October 2019 (\$32.4 million). In Canada, the total value of permits decreased 3.3% during the same time period.

On a **year-to-date** basis (January through October 2020), the preliminary total value of building permits issued in Yukon was \$132.4 million. This represents a decrease of \$22.7 million, or 14.6%, compared to the same time period in 2019 (\$155.1 million); the value of residential permits increased by \$8.6 million and non-residential permits decreased by \$31.3 million. The decrease in non-residential permits in 2020 is due in large part to permits issued in 2019 for the KDFN administration building.

## Note to Readers:

- 1) This release presents seasonally adjusted data, which facilitates month-to-month comparisons by removing the effects of seasonal variations. The Building Permits Survey covers 2,400 municipalities representing 95% of the Canadian population. The communities representing the other 5% of the population are very small and their levels of building activity have little impact on the total for the entire population. Building permits data are used as a leading indicator of activity in the construction industry. The value of planned construction activities presented in this release excludes engineering projects (such as waterworks, sewers or culverts) and land.
- Yukon Bureau of Statistics obtains data on building permits from Community Services and the City of Whitehorse on a monthly basis and publishes aggregated figures (unadjusted) in the Bureau's Monthly Statistical Review.
