



Building Permits, September 2021 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada - November 2, 2021

In September 2021, the preliminary seasonally adjusted value of building permits (\$30.6 million) in Yukon increased by \$20.6 million, or 207.0%, compared to September 2020 (\$10.0 million). In Canada, the total value of permits increased 4.9% during the same time period.

On a **year-to-date** basis, the preliminary total value of building permits issued in Yukon from January to September 2021 was \$153.0 million. This represents an increase of \$31.2 million, or 25.7%, compared to the same time period in 2020 (\$121.8 million); residential permits were up \$38.4 million, or 70.4%, and non-residential permits were down \$7.1 million, or 10.6%.

Note to Readers:

- 1) This release presents seasonally adjusted data (except where noted), which facilitates month-to-month comparisons by removing the effects of seasonal variations. The Building Permits Survey covers 2,400 municipalities representing 95% of the Canadian population. The communities representing the other 5% of the population are very small and their levels of building activity have little impact on the total for the entire population. Building permits data are used as a leading indicator of activity in the construction industry. The value of planned construction activities presented in this release excludes engineering projects (such as waterworks, sewers or culverts) and land.
- 2) Yukon Bureau of Statistics obtains data on building permits from Community Services and the City of Whitehorse on a monthly basis and publishes aggregated figures (unadjusted) in the Bureau's <u>Monthly Statistical Review</u>.
