Consumer Price Index, March 2020

Released by Statistics Canada — April 22, 2020

Comparing March 2020 to March 2019, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 2.7% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of March was 1.8 percentage points higher than that for Canada (0.9%).

The year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of March 2020 was mainly attributable to price increases in: electricity; rent; and homeowners' replacement cost. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in: telephone services; recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles); and gasoline.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse decreased 0.6% in March 2020 compared to March 2019; nationally, the CPI also decreased 0.6%.
