



Consumer Price Index, November 2019

Released by Statistics Canada — December 18, 2019

Comparing November 2019 to November 2018, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 2.3% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of November was 0.1 percentage point higher than that for Canada (2.2%).

The year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of November 2019 was mainly attributable to price increases in: rent; purchase and leasing of passenger vehicles; and homeowners' replacement cost. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in: telephone services; recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles); and fuel oil and other fuels.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse remained the same in November 2019 compared to October 2019; nationally, the CPI decreased 0.1%.

Note: Statistics Canada collects information on consumer prices and household spending patterns (Survey of Household Spending) to calculate the Consumer Price Index. The data collection covers urban and rural areas of provinces, and the capital cities of the territories.
