## Payroll employment, earnings and hours August 2020 (preliminary)

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Preliminary seasonally adjusted estimates show that in August 2020, Yukon had 20,878 jobs<sup>1</sup>, a decrease of 1,656 jobs, or 7.3%, compared to August 2019 and an increase of 1,041 jobs, or 5.2%, compared to July 2020.

Based on the preliminary estimates, compared to August 2019, the largest decline in the number of jobs was in the Accommodation and food services sector (619 jobs, or -32.8%) followed by the Trade sector\* (391 jobs, or -12.3%),

The August 2020 preliminary average weekly earnings figure for Yukon (\$1,281.67) was the third-highest in Canada, after the Northwest Territories (\$1,550.20) and Nunavut (\$1,450.23). Yukon's earnings figure was up 9.7% compared to the figure for August 2019, Canada's figure was up 7.9%.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The Survey of Employment, Payrolls and Hours (SEPH) estimates are produced monthly by integrating information from three sources: a census of payroll deduction records provided by the Canada Revenue Agency; the Business Payrolls Survey, and administrative records of federal, provincial and territorial public administration employment provided by these levels of government. These monthly estimates of the job numbers by detailed industry complement information from the Labour Force Survey (LFS), which is a household survey. The LFS includes people who are self-employed, as well as workers who take unpaid leave; SEPH does not cover these groups. Industry coverage for the LFS is comprehensive; SEPH excludes industry estimates for: agriculture; fishing and trapping; religious organizations; private household workers; and military personnel of defense services. The two surveys count multiple job holders differently. In the LFS, people with more than one job are counted only once as "employed"; SEPH counts filled positions on payroll, so each job is counted separately.
