Building Permits, January 2022 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada – March 4, 2022

In January 2022, the preliminary seasonally adjusted value of building permits (\$2.4 million) in Yukon decreased by \$44,000, or 1.8%, compared to January 2021 (\$2.5 million). In Canada, the total value of permits increased 1.0% during the same time period.

On an **annual** basis, the **revised** total value of building permits issued in Yukon in 2021 was \$199.0 million. This represents an increase of \$56.3 million, or 39.4%, compared to 2020 (\$142.7 million); residential permits were up \$38.2 million, or 55.0%, and non-residential permits were up \$18.1 million, or 24.7%.

Note to Readers:

- 1) This release presents seasonally adjusted data (except where noted), which facilitates month-to-month comparisons by removing the effects of seasonal variations. The Building Permits Survey covers 2,400 municipalities representing 95% of the Canadian population. The communities representing the other 5% of the population are very small and their levels of building activity have little impact on the total for the entire population. Building permits data are used as a leading indicator of activity in the construction industry. The value of planned construction activities presented in this release excludes engineering projects (such as waterworks, sewers or culverts) and land.
- 2) Yukon Bureau of Statistics obtains data on building permits from Community Services and the City of Whitehorse on a monthly basis and publishes aggregated figures (unadjusted) in the Bureau's Monthly Statistical Review.
