



Building Permits, July 2022 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada – September 1, 2022

In July 2022, the preliminary seasonally adjusted value of building permits (\$19.2 million) in Yukon decreased by \$952,000, or 4.7%, compared to July 2021 (\$20.2 million). In Canada, the total value of permits increased by 9.6% during the same time period.

On a **year-to-date** basis (January through July) in 2022, the preliminary total value of building permits issued in Yukon was \$151.4 million. This represents an increase of \$43.1 million, or 39.8%, compared to the same time period in 2021 (\$108.3 million); residential permits were down \$15.4 million, or 24.1%, and non-residential permits were up \$58.5 million, or 132.2%.

Note to Readers:

- 1) This release presents seasonally adjusted data (except where noted), which facilitates month-to-month comparisons by removing the effects of seasonal variations. The Building Permits Survey covers 2,400 municipalities representing 95% of the Canadian population. The communities representing the other 5% of the population are very small and their levels of building activity have little impact on the total for the entire population. Building permits data are used as a leading indicator of activity in the construction industry. The value of planned construction activities presented in this release excludes engineering projects (such as waterworks, sewers or culverts) and land.
- 2) Yukon Bureau of Statistics obtains data on building permits from Community Services and the City of Whitehorse on a monthly basis and publishes aggregated figures (unadjusted) in the Bureau's [Monthly Statistical Review](#).
