## **Building Permits, September 2022**

Released by Statistics Canada - November 3, 2022

In September 2022, the preliminary seasonally adjusted value of building permits (\$13.0 million) in Yukon decreased by \$13.6 million, or 51.1%, compared to September 2021 (\$26.6 million). In Canada, the total value of permits decreased by 2.5% during the same time period.

On a **year-to-date basis** (January through September) in 2022, the preliminary total value of building permits issued in Yukon was \$172.1 million. This represents an increase of \$23.4 million, or 15.7%, compared to the same time period in 2021 (\$148.7 million); residential permits were down by \$28.3 million, or 32.0%, and non-residential permits were up by \$51.7 million, or 85.9%.

## Note to Readers:

- 1) This release presents seasonally adjusted data (except where noted), which facilitates month-to-month comparisons by removing the effects of seasonal variations. The Building Permits Survey covers 2,400 municipalities representing 95% of the Canadian population. The communities representing the other 5% of the population are very small and their levels of building activity have little impact on the total for the entire population. Building permits data are used as a leading indicator of activity in the construction industry. The value of planned construction activities presented in this release excludes engineering projects (such as waterworks, sewers or culverts) and land.
- 2) Yukon Bureau of Statistics obtains data on building permits from Community Services and the City of Whitehorse on a monthly basis and publishes aggregated figures (unadjusted) in the Bureau's Monthly Statistical Review.
