



Building Permits, September 2023

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In September 2023, the preliminary seasonally adjusted <u>current dollar</u> value of building permits (\$5.2 million) in Yukon decreased by \$8.7 million, or 62.9%, compared to September 2022 (\$13.9 million). In Canada, the total value of permits increased by 8.0% during the same time period.

On a year-to-date basis (January through September) in 2023, the preliminary total <u>current dollar</u> value of building permits issued in Yukon was \$204.8 million. This represents an increase of \$31.4 million, or 18.1%, compared to the same time period in 2022 (\$173.5 million); the value of residential permits decreased by \$4.8 million, or 7.8%, and the value of non-residential permits was up by \$36.2 million, or 32.4%.



On a <u>constant dollar</u> basis (2012 = 100), the preliminary seasonally adjusted value of building permits (\$3.0 million in 2012 dollars) decreased 64.1% compared to September 2022 (\$8.3 million in 2012 dollars). In Canada, the total value of building permits increased by 4.1% during the same period.

On a **year-to-date basis**, (January through September) in 2023, the total value of building permits issued in Yukon (\$131.1 million in 2012 dollars) increased 12.7% compared to the same time period in 2022 (\$116.4 million in 2012 dollars); the value of residential permits decreased by 11.5%, and the value of non-residential permits increased by 22.8%.

Note to Readers:

- 1) This release presents seasonally adjusted data (except where noted), which facilitates month-to-month comparisons by removing the effects of seasonal variations. The Building Permits Survey covers 2,400 municipalities representing 95% of the Canadian population. The communities representing the other 5% of the population are very small and their levels of building activity have little impact on the total for the entire population. Building permits data are used as a leading indicator of activity in the construction industry. The value of planned construction activities presented in this release excludes engineering projects (such as waterworks, sewers or culverts) and land.
- 2) Yukon Bureau of Statistics obtains data on building permits from Community Services and the City of Whitehorse on a monthly basis and publishes aggregated figures (unadjusted) in the Bureau's Monthly Statistical Review.
