





Consumer Price Index, April 2024

Released by Statistics Canada — May 21, 2024

Comparing April 2024 to April 2023, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 1.8% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of April 2024 (1.8%) was 0.9 percentage points lower than that for Canada (2.7%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of April 2024 were mortgage interest cost; food purchased from restaurants; and rent. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in telephone services; fuel oil and other fuels; and women's clothing.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse increased by 0.3% in April 2024 compared to March 2024; while nationally, the CPI increased by 0.5%.
