



Consumer Price Index, February 2023

Released by Statistics Canada – March 21, 2023

Comparing February 2023 to February 2022, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 7.0% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of February 2023 was 1.8 percentage points higher than that for Canada (5.2%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of February 2023 were Traveller accommodation; Mortgage interest cost; and Fuel oil and other fuels. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in Childcare and housekeeping services; Internet access services; and Home entertainment equipment, parts and services.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse increased by 0.1% in February 2023 compared to January 2023; while nationally, the CPI increased by 0.4%.
