





Consumer Price Index, January 2024

Released by Statistics Canada – February 20, 2024

Comparing January 2024 to January 2023, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 2.6% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of January 2024 (2.6%) was 0.3 percentage points lower than that for Canada (2.9%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of January 2024 were mortgage interest cost; traveller accommodation; and food purchased from restaurants. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in telephone services; fuel oil and other fuels; and childcare and housekeeping services.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse decreased by 0.4% in January 2024 compared to December 2023; while nationally, the CPI remained the same.
