

## Consumer Price Index, September 2023

Released by Statistics Canada – October 17, 2023

Comparing September 2023 to September 2022, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased 3.8% in Whitehorse (data are not available for Yukon). Whitehorse's year-over-year CPI change for the month of September 2023 was the same as that for Canada (3.8%).

The main contributors to the year-over-year increase in Whitehorse CPI for the month of September 2023 were mortgage interest cost; traveller accommodation; and food purchased from restaurants. Some of these increases were offset by price decreases in telephone services; child care and housekeeping services; and inter-city transportation.

On a monthly basis, the CPI in Whitehorse decreased by 0.8% in September 2023 compared to August 2023; while nationally, the CPI decreased by 0.1%.
