



Employment Insurance, December 2022 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada – February 16, 2023

In December 2022, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits¹ in Yukon was 480; of which 310 were males and 170 were females. Compared to December 2021, the total number of beneficiaries decreased by 350, or 42.2%; compared to the November 2022 preliminary figure, the total number of beneficiaries decreased by 30, or 5.9%.

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in December 2022 decreased by 39.7% compared to December 2021 and decreased by 2.0% compared to the November 2022 preliminary figure.

Notes to Readers:

- No methodological changes were made to the Employment Insurance Statistics (EIS) program over the COVID-19 period. EIS reflect the Employment Insurance (EI) program for the Labour Force Survey (LFS) reference week in each month.
- The number of beneficiaries is a measure of all people who received regular EI benefits from December 4 to 10, 2022. This period coincides with the reference week of the LFS.
