



Employment Insurance, January 2024 (preliminary)

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In January 2024, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits¹ in Yukon was 580; of which, 380 were males and 200 were females. Compared to January 2023, the total number of beneficiaries increased by 110, or 23.4%; compared to the December 2023 preliminary figure, the total number of beneficiaries remained unchanged (580).

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in January 2024 increased by 18.0% compared to January 2023 and increased by 0.3% compared to the December 2023 preliminary figure.

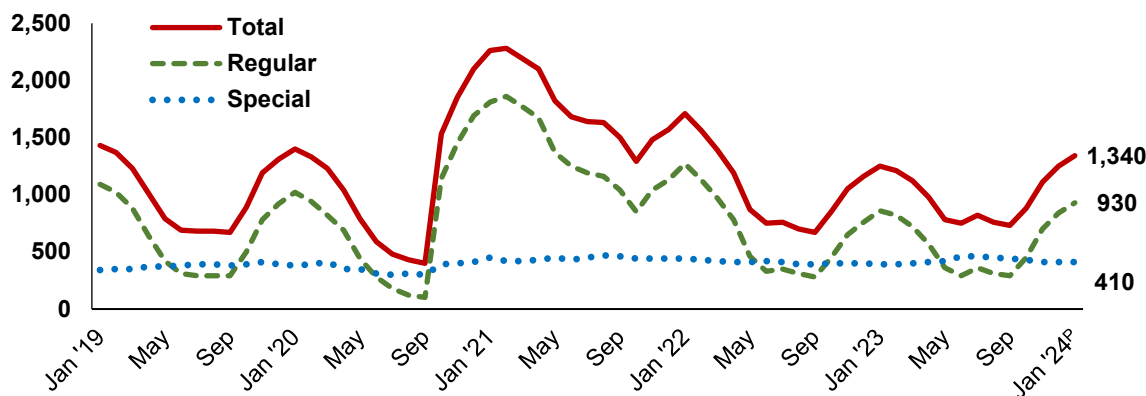
