



## Employment Insurance, November 2023 (preliminary)

Released by Statistics Canada – January 19, 2024

In November 2023, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits<sup>1</sup> in Yukon was 580; of which, 390 were males and 190 were females. Compared to November 2022, the total number of beneficiaries increased by 50, or 9.4%; compared to the October 2023 preliminary figure, the total number of beneficiaries increased by 10, or 1.8%.

Nationally, the preliminary number of EI beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in November 2023 increased by 13.1% compared to November 2022 and increased by 1.7% compared to the October 2023 preliminary figure.

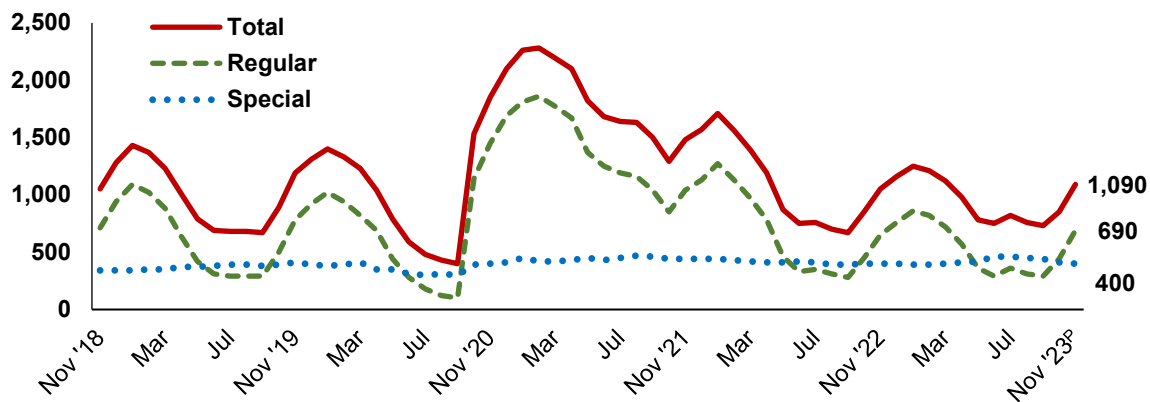
