Employment Insurance, October 2022 (preliminary data)

Released by Statistics Canada – December 15, 2022

In October 2022, the preliminary number of El beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) receiving regular income support benefits¹ in Yukon was 580; of which 390 were males and 190 were females. Compared to October 2021, the total number of beneficiaries decreased by 390, or 40.2%; compared to the September 2022 preliminary figure, the total number of beneficiaries decreased by 30, or 4.9%.

Nationally, the preliminary number of El beneficiaries (seasonally adjusted) in October 2022 decreased by 42.4% compared to October 2021 and decreased by 3.2% compared to the September 2022 preliminary figure.

Notes to Readers:

- No methodological changes were made to the Employment Insurance Statistics (EIS) program over the COVID-19 period. EIS reflect the Employment Insurance (EI) program for the Labour Force Survey (LFS) reference week in each month.
- The number of beneficiaries is a measure of all people who received regular El benefits from October 9 to 15, 2022. This period coincides with the reference week of the LFS.
