# Census '96

# Family and Household Income

The following statistics are from the 1996 Census of Canada which occurred on May 14, 1996.

#### 1 Highlights

- ♦ In 1995, the Yukon reported the highest average family income in Canada. The average Yukon family reported an income of \$61,807 compared to the Canadian average of \$54,583.
- Between 1990 and 1995 the average family income in the Yukon decreased by \$771 from \$62,578 to \$61,807.
- In the Yukon, a family with a husband, a wife and a child with employment income had the highest average income (\$93,850). Female lone-parent families had the lowest average income (\$34,291).
- ◆ In 1995, the Yukon ranked second behind the Northwest Territories in average household income. The Yukon's average household income was \$54,953 compared with the Canadian average of \$48,552.
- Between 1990 and 1995 the average household income in the Yukon fell by \$2,797 from \$57,750 to \$54,953.
- In the Yukon, five person households had the highest average income (\$75,042). One person non-family households had the lowest average household income (\$29,146).





#### Average Family Income by Family Structure, Yukon, 1995



#### **Notes**

**Census family**: Refers to a now-married couple (with or without never-married sons and/or daughters of either or both spouses), a couple living common-law (with or without never-married sons and/or daughters of either or both partners) or a lone parent of any marital status, with at least one never-married son or daughter living in the same dwelling.

**Household**: Refers to a person or group of persons (other than foreign residents), who occupy the same dwelling and do not have a usual place of residence elsewhere in Canada. It may consist of a family group (census family) with or without other non-family persons, of two or more families sharing a dwelling, of a group of unrelated persons, or of one person living alone. Household members who are temporarily absent on Census Day (e.g., temporarily residents elsewhere) are considered as part of their usual household. For census purposes, every person is a member of one and only one household. Unless otherwise specified, all data in household reports are for private households only.
