Families - Number, Type and Structure

The following statistics are from the 1996 Census of Canada which occurred on May 14, 1996.


1—Highlights

- In Yukon, the total number of families rose by 13.6% from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number rose by 6.6%.
- In Yukon, the number of now-married couple families rose by 5.6% from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number rose by 1.7%.
- In Yukon, the number of common-law couple families rose by 28.7% from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number rose by 28.0%.
- In Yukon, the number of lone-parent families rose by 28.4% from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number rose by 19.3%.

2— Census Families, Yukon, 1971 to 1996


In 1996, the number of families in Yukon was 8,070, up by 965 or 13.6% from 1991. The total population increased 10.7% from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number of families was 7,837,865, up by 482,135 or 6.6%. The total population increased 5.7% from 1991 to 1996.

A census family is defined as a now-married couple (with or without never-married sons and/or daughters of either or both spouses), a couple living common-law (with or without never-married sons and/or daughters of either or both partners) or a lone parent of any marital status with at least one never-married son or daughter living in the same dwelling.



From 1991 to 1996 the number of married couple families in the Yukon fell from 65.3% of all families to 60.7% of all families. At the same time, commonlaw families increased from 20.1% of all families in 1991 to 22.8% of all families in 1996. Lone parent families increased from 14.6% of all families in 1991 to 16.5% of all families in 1996.
