## Families - Number, Type and Structure

The following statistics are from the 1996 Census of Canada which occurred on May 14, 1996.

## -1 Highlights

- In Yukon, the total number of families rose by $13.6 \%$ from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number rose by $6.6 \%$.
- In Yukon, the number of now-married couple families rose by 5.6\% from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number rose by $1.7 \%$.
- In Yukon, the number of common-law couple families rose by $28.7 \%$ from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number rose by $28.0 \%$.
- In Yukon, the number of lone-parent families rose by $28.4 \%$ from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number rose by $19.3 \%$.


## 2-Census Families, Yukon, 1971 to 1996

In 1996, the number of families in Yukon was 8,070 , up by 965 or $13.6 \%$ from 1991. The total population increased $10.7 \%$ from 1991 to 1996. In Canada, the number of families was $7,837,865$, up by 482,135 or $6.6 \%$. The total population increased $5.7 \%$ from 1991 to 1996.

A census family is defined as a now-married couple (with or without never-married sons and/or daughters of either or both spouses), a couple living common-law (with or without never-married sons and/or daughters of either or both partners) or a lone parent of any marital status with at least one never-married son or daughter living in the same dwelling.

From 1991 to 1996 the number of married couple families in the Yukon fell from $65.3 \%$ of all families to $60.7 \%$ of all families. At the same time, commonlaw families increased from $20.1 \%$ of all families in 1991 to $22.8 \%$ of all families
 in 1996. Lone parent families increased from $14.6 \%$ of all families in 1991 to 16.5\% of all families in 1996.
