Census '96

Population and Dwelling Counts

The following statistics are the first release from the 1996 Census of Canada which occurred on May 14, 1996.

1 Highlights

- The population of the Yukon, as enumerated by the 1996 Census, on May 14, 1996, was **30,766**, just under 3,000 (10.7%) more than in 1991 (27,797).
- In 1996, 60% of the Yukon's population lived in urban areas, almost the same as in 1991.
- The number of occupied private dwellings in the Yukon climbed to 11,584 in 1996, from 9,915 in 1991.



Note: Statistics Canada defines a "dwelling" as a separate set of living quarters with a private entrance either from outside or from a common hall, lobby or stairway inside the building. A "dwelling" must have (a) a source of heat or power, (b) access to a source of drinking water, and (c) an enclosed space that provides shelter from the elements.

Notes For Using Census Figures

Differences between the population count from the 1996 Census and the count from the Yukon Health Care system are due to three factors:

- 1) The Census is a "de jure" population count, ie., it includes only those individuals who consider themselves fully resident in the Yukon. Figures from the Yukon Health Care system are a "current" or "de facto" population count, i.e., the figures include those individuals who are in the Yukon at least long enough to register for Health Care or to be employed.
- 2) Census figures under enumerate population counts simply because it is virtually impossible to ensure 100% coverage of a particular area. For example, the 1991 Census under enumerated the Yukon's population by 4.06%.
- 3) The 1996 Census and the Yukon Health Care population counts use different methods of locating individuals within the Yukon. The Census is based on enumeration areas whereas the Yukon Health Care estimates locate individuals by postal code.

Additional statistics from the 1996 Census will be available in the coming months. The next release, scheduled for July 1997, will provide information on age, sex, marital status, dwellings, households and families.
