#### Yukon Labour Demand Survey 2022

#### Highlights:

- In the fall of 2022, 80% of employees in Yukon businesses were full-time workers; 88.7% of all employees worked in Whitehorse.
- There were 1,126 current vacancies in the fall of 2022, and businesses expected an additional 941 job vacancies in 2023 and/or 2024.
- The largest number of vacant jobs was in the Construction sector (223 vacancies), followed by Retail trade sector (123 vacancies) and the Accommodation and food services sector (114 vacancies).

In the fall of 2022, the Yukon Bureau of Statistics (YBS) contacted Yukon businesses, crown corporations, as well as First Nation development corporations, to collect information about their current employment situation, current vacancies and expected vacancies through 2024. These data are presented on pages 1 through 10 of this report.

Note: Throughout this report, values in rows and/or columns may not sum to their respective totals due to weighting and rounding.



In the fall of 2022, there were 3,339 businesses<sup>1</sup> in Yukon employing 14,360 employees. Of them, 80.0% were in full-time and 20.0% were in part-time employment.

Whitehorse had the largest number of employees in Yukon (12,737, or 88.7%), followed by Dawson City (1,046 employees, or 7.3%), and Mayo (166 employees, or 1.2%). About 4 in 10 Yukon businesses (1,365 businesses) reported not having any employees at the time of the survey. The most common reason for a business not to have employees was Owner-operated or business too small (1,100 businesses), followed by Unable to find qualified employees (98 businesses), No need (86 businesses), and Seasonal operations (69 businesses).

In the fall of 2022, 80.0% of all employees in Yukon businesses were fulltime. Construction had the largest number of full-time employees (1,460), followed by Retail trade (1,427). The largest number of part-time employees was in Retail trade (656), followed by Accommodation and food services (506).

In the fall of 2022, 80.1% of all employees in Yukon businesses were permanent. Retail trade had the largest number of permanent employees (1,891), followed by Health care and social assistance (1,273) and Construction (1,154).

Of all employees, 15.4% were seasonal and 4.5% were term, temporary, casual or on-call employees. Arts, entertainment and recreation had the largest percentage of non-permanent employees (64.5%); followed by Accommodation and food services (35.9%); and Mining, quarrying, and oil and gas extraction (33.1%).

In the fall of 2022, businesses reported 1,126 vacant jobs. The largest number of vacant jobs was in the Construction sector with 233 vacancies (20.7% of all vacancies) in 120 positions. Businesses in Accommodation and food services had the second highest number of job vacancies with 144 vacant jobs in 53 positions. Businesses in the Retail trade sector had the third highest number of vacancies, with 123 vacant jobs.

Of the vacant jobs in the fall of 2022, the vast majority (90.0%), were full-time jobs, while 9.9% were part-time jobs.

The largest number of job vacancies was in Transport and heavy equipment operation and related maintenance occupations (150 vacancies) followed by Industrial, electrical and construction trades (143 vacancies); and Service support and other service occupations, n.e.c. (134 vacancies).

In the fall of 2022, Yukon businesses reported 1,126 job vacancies. Of the vacancies, 539 jobs, or 47.9%, did not have a minimum requirement of education. There were 217 jobs, or 19.3%, that required a high school diploma or equivalent; 189 jobs, or 16.8%, required apprenticeship or trade certificate or diploma; 74 jobs, or 6.6%, required a college, CEGEP and other non-university diploma or certificate; 28 jobs, or 2.5%, required a university certificate or diploma below bachelor's level; and 54 of the vacant jobs, or 4.8%, required a bachelor's degree or higher from a university.

The occupations with the highest number of job vacancies requiring an education level above high school were in Industrial, electrical, and construction trades occupations (55 vacancies), Maintenance and equipment operation trades (53 vacancies) and Paraprofessional occupations in law and social, community and education services (33 job vacancies).

The job vacancies with the highest average hourly wage were in Professional occupations in health (except nursing) at \$52.76, followed by Professional occupations in nursing, and Processing, manufacturing and utilities supervisors and central control operators at \$41.59 and \$39.74, respectively.

The lowest average hourly wage was \$16.90 for Sales support occupations; followed by \$18.77 for Service support and other service occupations, n.e.c; and \$19.53 for Service representatives and other customer and personal services occupations.

The job vacancy with the highest maximum hourly wage (\$76.92) was in Specialized middle management occupations, followed by Technical occupations related to natural and applied sciences (\$61.18).

There was a high degree of variance in average hourly wages for vacancies requiring a bachelor's degree, ranging from a low of \$25.00 in Finance, insurance and related business administrative occupations to a high of \$59.62 in Professional occupations in health (except nursing) — a difference of \$34.62 per hour.

For those jobs which required at least a college, CEGEP or other non-university certificate or diploma, the average hourly wage ranged from \$17.00 in Service representatives and other customer and personal service occupations, to \$48.43 in Middle management occupations in retail and wholesale trade and customer services — a difference of \$31.43 per hour.

For positions that required no minimum level of education, the lowest average hourly wage offered was \$16.50 in Sales support occupations, while the highest average hourly wage offered was \$47.18 in Specialized middle management occupations — a difference of \$30.68 per hour.

Businesses reported actively recruiting for 80.6% of the job vacancies during the survey. Active recruitment was not pursued during the time of the survey for 17.9% of the vacancies. The occupation that had the highest number of vacant jobs not actively being recruited at the time of the survey, was Transport and heavy equipment operation and related maintenance occupations (28 vacant jobs).

About one-third of the active job vacancies (36.3%) had been advertised for less than 90 days at the time of the survey, while 28.4% had been advertised for 90 days or more and 34.6% were continuously advertised vacancies.

Among occupations with more than one vacancy, Distribution, tracking and scheduling co-ordination occupations; Middle management occupations in trades, transportation, production and utilities; and Labourers in processing, manufacturing and utilities had the highest proportion of vacancies that were open for less than 90 days (100.0%). Distribution, tracking and scheduling co-ordination occupations had the highest proportion of vacancies that were open for less than 30 days (72.7%) among occupations with more than one vacancy.

There were 258 jobs (28.4% of vacancies) that businesses had tried to fill for over 90 days. The Industrial, electrical and construction trades (51 jobs) and Service support and other service occupations, n.e.c. (35 jobs) had the most vacancies advertised for over 90 days.



Businesses expected an additional 941 job vacancies in 2023 and/or 2024, which included vacancies due to turnover as well as the creation of new jobs. The occupation that had the most expected additional job vacancies was Firefighter with 202 expected vacancies, followed by Material handlers with 144 expected vacancies, and Fire chiefs and senior firefighting officers with 77 expected vacancies.

# Current and Expected Future Additional Vacancies: Comparison of 2016, 2018, 2020 and 2022 Survey Results

Comparing the 2022 Labour Demand Survey with that of 2020, the number of current vacancies in Yukon increased by 504 (from 622 in 2020 to 1,126 in 2022). A higher number of vacancies indicates that businesses demand for labour is not being met by a supply of labour that has the skills and experience needed to fill currently vacant positions.

In 2022, Yukon businesses reported expecting 941 additional vacancies in 2023/24, slightly lower than the 1,278 expected additional vacancies anticipated for 2021/22 by businesses during the 2020 Labour Demand Survey.
