# Yukon Monthly Statistical Review June 2019

#### Highlights:

- In the 1st quarter of 2019, the total value of real estate transactions in Yukon was \$54.8 million: \$49.6 million in Whitehorse and \$5.1 million for the rest of Yukon.
- In May 2019 on a year-over-year basis, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for Whitehorse increased 1.8% (figures for Yukon are not available); o.6 percentage points lower than that for Canada (2.4%)

#### New publication this month: Yukon Real Estate Report, First Quarter 2019



The total value of Yukon's real estate transactions in the first quarter increased in 2019 compared to the first quarter of 2018. In the first quarter of 2019, the total value of real estate transactions was \$54.8 million (a record-high for first quarters) compared to \$42.7 million in the same period in 2018, an increase of \$12.0 million, or 28.2%.






Did you know?

#### 1.4 Migration Estimates\*



Preliminary estimates of Statistics Canada show that in the first quarter of 2019, Yukon lost 240 people through net migration — 25 were lost through international migration and 215 were lost through interprovincial migration.

Of the interprovincial migrants, net gains were from:

- Northwest Territories (+27);
- New Brunswick (+12); and Manitoba (+8).

Conversely, **net losses** were to: • British Columbia (-71);

- Nova Scotia (-55); •
- Quebec (-48); .
- Alberta (-38); .
- Nunavut (-22);
- Saskatchewan; (-17); and Ontario (-11). .



#### Did you know?

The unemployment rate for Yukon's youth (aged 15-24) increased from 7.1% in May 2019 to 10.3% in June of 2019. This is the first month since February of 2017, that the rate of unemployed youth has been over 10.0%

Comparing June 2019 to May 2019, employment in the services-producing sector decreased by 300, or 1.6%. The goods-producing sector's employment increased by 400, or 11.8%.

In June 2019, of the 21,900 employed Yukoners, 9,000, or 41.1%, were in the public sector. Of the 12,900 workers in the private sector, 3,300, or 25.6%, were selfemployed.



- Gasoline;
- Footwear; and
- Women's clothing.


On a **month-to-month** basis, from April 2019 to May 2019, the CPI for Whitehorse (figures for Yukon are not available) increased 0.5%.

Major contributors to the month-to-month **increases** were the prices of:

- Traveller accommodation;
- Inter-city transportation, and
- Passenger vehicle insurance premiums.

Major contributors to month-to-month **decreases** were the prices of:

- Recreational equipment and services (excluding recreational vehicles);
- Women's clothing; and
- Footwear.





Yukon's preliminary **retail sales** in April 2019 increased by \$6.3 million, or 9.7%, compared to April 2018. Canada's retail sales increased 4.7% over the same time period. Year-to-date (January to April), Yukon's retail sales increased by \$11.7 million, or 5.1%, compared to the same time period in 2018; Canada's retail sales increased 2.6% over the same time period.

Yukon's preliminary **wholesale sales** in April 2019 increased by \$662,000, or 5.2%, compared to April 2018. Canada's wholesale sales increased 7.5% over the same time period. Year-to-date (January to April), Yukon's wholesale sales increased by \$3.3 million, or 7.3%, compared to the same time period in 2018; Canada's wholesale sales increased 3.4% over the same time period.

#### Did you know?

In April 2019 Yukon's preliminary sales from *Gasoline Stations* was \$12.0 million, accounting for 16.8 % of total sales.

Comparing April 2019 to April 2018, total receipts for food services and drinking places in Yukon decreased by \$33,000, or 0.7%; Canada's receipts increased 4.7%.

These figures are derived from the Yukon Rent Survey which is conducted on a semi-annual basis in April and December since 2014. Prior to 2014, the survey was conducted on a quarterly basis and only included buildings with 3 or more rental units (4 or more rental units prior to 2012). Although the methodology of the 2014 survey includes all types of buildings with rental units (displayed in table 5.1), the Yukon Bureau of Statistics continues to generate data for buildings with 3 or more rental units for historical comparisons (displayed in 5.2 and 5.3).



#### 5.3 Median Rent and Vacancy Rates for Units in Buildings with 3 or More Rental Units, Whitehorse, 2014-2018




#### 6.1 Number and Value of Real Estate Transactions\*, Whitehorse

#### 6.3 Number of Residential Transactions 1<sup>st</sup> Q 2015 to 1<sup>st</sup> Q 2019




#### Did you know?

In the first quarter of 2019, the total value in sales of single detached houses in Whitehorse was \$22.9 million, an increase of \$1.2 million, or 5.5%, compared to the first quarter of 2018 (\$21.7 million).

In the 1st quarter of 2019, the total value of real estate transactions in Yukon was \$54.8 million: \$49.6 million in Whitehorse and \$5.1 million for the rest of Yukon. Comparing the 1st quarter of 2019 to that of 2018, the total value of Yukon's real estate transactions increased by \$12.0 million, or 28.2%.

#### 7.1 Yukon Building Permits, Number and Construction Value\*




From January through June 2019, a total of 873 building permits were issued in Yukon, at a construction value of \$83.3 million. The construction value of permits increased by \$18.9 million, or 29.4%, compared to the total value of permits issued from January through June 2018. Of the total construction value of building permits issued in January through June 2019:

- 29.9% was for residential;
- 0.1% for industrial;


- 43.5% was for government/institutional; and

#### 7.3 Residential Permits (New or Converted Dwellings Units)\*, Yukon, June 2015 to June 2019




#### Did you know?





Average June 19, 2019 Prices (cents per litre)







#### 1. Population

#### 2. Employment

2.1 Yukon figures are rounded to the nearest hundred; because of this, figures may not sum to totals. Monthly figures from the Labour Force Survey are threemonth moving averages based on 92% coverage and are seasonally adjusted, which refers to the technique of adjusting raw figures to remove seasonal movements; however, annual figures are unadjusted.

2.2 Yukon, Northwest Territories and Nunavut are not included in the Canadian unemployment rate.

2.3 *Public Employees* are those who work for: a government at the federal, provincial, territorial, municipal, First Nations or other Aboriginal government level; a government service or agency; a Crown corporation; or a funded establishment such as schools (including colleges/universities), hospitals and public libraries. Yukon figures are rounded to the nearest hundred; because of this, figures may not sum to totals. All monthly Yukon figures from the Labour Force Survey are three-month moving averages based on 92% coverage.

2.4 & 2.5 Unclassified businesses' employees are excluded, as well as those enterprises primarily involved in agriculture, fishing and trapping, private household services, religious organizations, and military personnel of defence services.

2.6 All types includes people receiving regular, work-sharing, fishing, and special benefits. Regular benefits include people receiving regular income support benefits, whether or not they are participating in one of three employment benefit programs, namely Skills Development Program, Job Creation Partnerships Program, and Self-employment Program. 3.1 & 3.2 The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures price changes over time but should not be used to compare costs between provinces and cities.

#### 4. Trade

4.2 Total includes additional North American Industry Classifications (NAICS) data which are not displayed, including: Furniture and Home Furnishings Stores; Electronics and Appliance Stores; Building Material and Garden Equipment and Supplies Dealers; Food and Beverage Stores; Clothing and Clothing Accessory Stores; Sporting Goods, Hobby, Book and Music Stores and General Merchandise Stores.

#### 5. Rental Units

5.1, 5.2 & 5.3 These figures are derived from the Yukon Rent Survey which, as of 2014, is now conducted on a semi-annual basis in April and December. Prior to 2014, the survey was conducted on a quarterly basis and only included buildings with 3 or more rental units (4 or more rental units prior to 2012). Although the methodology of the 2014 survey includes buildings with 1 or more rental units (displayed in 5.1), the Yukon Bureau of Statistics continues to generate data for buildings with 3 or more rental units for historical comparisons (displayed in 5.2 and 5.3).

#### 6. Real Estate

6.1 Total includes residential lots and multiple-residential sales, which are generally too low to release due to confidentiality requirements, and non-residential sales (commercial and industrial properties). For further explanation, contact Yukon Bureau of Statistics.

9.1 As of July 2018, all aircraft movement figures are now sourced from Statistics Canada.

9.2 This table includes persons entering Yukon by land, air, train and water at Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) ports of entry. It does not include: immigrants and former residents; non-resident crews; and Canadian crews. Although there is no permanent CBSA land port of entry in Dawson City, special annual international events between Yukon and Alaska, namely Yukon Quest and Trek Over the Top, require participants to cross the border by land. For border crossing purposes, participants in Yukon Quest are counted as pedestrians while participants in Trek Over the Top are counted as crossings by automobile.
