## **Labour Force Survey, February 2021**

Released by Statistics Canada - March 12, 2021


In February 2021, Yukon's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate was 6.8%. Canada's unemployment rate for the month was 8.2%. Compared to the figures for January 2021, Yukon's seasonally adjusted labour force (23,600) increased by 300; the number of employed (22,100) increased by 200; and the number of unemployed (1,600) increased by 300.

## **Supplementary notes:**

- Yukon's February 2021 labour force would be 24,200 when the number is adjusted to the prepandemic population to labour force ratio.
- Yukon's February 2021 number of unemployed would be 2,100 when the number is adjusted to reflect the decrease in labour force (i.e., increase in "not in labour force") due to COVID-19.
- Yukon's February 2021 unemployment rate would be 8.5% when unemployment is adjusted to reflect the decrease in labour force (i.e., increase in "not in labour force") due to COVID-19.
- Canada's unemployment rate would be 10.7% when persons "not in labour force, but wanted work" are added to the labour force.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>2</sup> 'Change' is measured in percent, or percentage points, where applicable. Percentage points are the actual numerical difference between two percentages, such as: 10% - 8% = 2 percentage points.
