Individual¹ Income² of All Taxfilers, 2019

Released by Statistics Canada — July 15, 2021

In Yukon, the median total income for all individual taxfilers for the 2019 tax year was \$50,800; Yukon ranked the highest in the country followed closely by the Northwest Territories (\$50,630). Compared to 2018, Yukon's median total income for individuals increased by \$1,650, or 3.4%. Nationally, the median total income for individual taxfilers increased by \$1,030, or 2.8%, compared to 2018.

The median total income for male taxfilers in Yukon (\$53,030) was the third-highest in the country following the Northwest Territories (\$53,600); and Alberta (\$53,180); and \$8,880 higher than Canada's median total income (\$44,150) for males. The median total income for female taxfilers in Yukon (\$48,600) was the highest in the country and \$15,920 higher than that of Canada.
