

Annual Wages, Salaries and Commissions, 2019

Released by Statistics Canada — March 11, 2021

In Yukon, 21,290 individuals aged 15 and over filed a T1 Income Tax and Benefit Return and reported income from wages, salaries and commissions in 2019. The median annual income from wages, salaries and commissions was \$49,330, which ranked Yukon the second-highest in the country following the Northwest Territories (\$53,590). Compared to 2018 (in 2019 constant dollars), Yukon's median income from employment and commissions increased by \$170, or 0.3%; nationally, there was an increase was \$190, or 0.5%.

The 2019 median income from wages, salaries and commissions *for male taxfilers* in Yukon (\$52,670) was the third-highest in the country following the Northwest Territories (\$57,950) and Alberta (\$57,340); and \$6,620, or 14.4%, higher than Canada's median income (\$46,050). The median income from wages, salaries and commissions *for female taxfilers* in Yukon (\$46,340) was the second-highest in the country following the Northwest Territories (\$50,430) and \$12,700, or 37.8%, higher than that of Canada (\$33,640).

Notes:

The extension in the deadlines for filing taxes and for the payment of taxes without penalty granted by the Canada Revenue Agency impacted the completeness of the 2019 preliminary income tax data used in this release. Therefore, caution should be used with this data when interpreting moderate changes in counts between 2018 and 2019.

Wages, salaries and commissions include employment pay and commissions as stated on T4 information slips, training allowances, tips, gratuities and royalties. It also includes tax-exempt employment income earned on an Indian reserve.

All figures for previous years are in constant dollars and have been adjusted for inflation.
