Background

The Carcross area was originally inhabited by the Tagish people, who camped at the site of the present village to hunt caribou. As they began trading and inter-marrying with the coastal Tlingit people, they adopted the Tlingit way of life. Today, the First Nation is represented by both its Tagish and Tlingit heritage and attempts are being made to maintain both language and cultural traditions.

Carcross developed as a stop-over place for gold-rush stamperders at the turn of the century. It is located at the end of Bennet Lake, where the White Pass and Yukon Railway established a station to pick up miners and equipment before travelling to Whitehorse or Skagway.

A residential school was established in 1901 by a missionary, Bishop Bompas. The last school, Choutla Residential School, was built in 1956 by the Canadian government after a 1939 fire destroyed the church school. Although government financed after that time the Anglican Church continued their operation of the school, and it was attended by aboriginal students from all over the Yukon. The school closed in the 1960's, but continued to be used until October 1993, when it was demolished in order to restore the land to its natural state.

When the White Pass and Yukon Route railroad was discontinued in 1982, the South Klondike Highway became the lifeline of the community. It is possible that the railway, one of the few narrow-gauges in the world, will once more extend to Carcross. At present, the railroad originates in Skagway, Alaska and ends in Bennet Lake, B.C.

Reserve Land: 64.75 Ha. On the south shore of Nares Lake.

Land Set Aside: 250.955 Ha. In and Around Carcross and Tagish.

Parcels of Land Set Aside: 1 parcel and 50 lots.

Land Claims and Self Government

Negotiations of the Final and Self Government Agreements pursuant to the Umbrella Final Agreement have commenced.

Health Care

Health care is provided through the community health centre in Carcross. It offers daily service and is staffed by two nurses. A nurse provides service once a week in Tagish. The health centre also supplies 24-hour emergency service. A volunteer ambulance service in Carcross covers Tagish and the surrounding area.

Social Services

YTG Health and Social Services provides social worker services in Carcross. The Carcross/ Tagish First Nation offers social services to members who live in the Carcross and Tagish area. Services include social assistance, in-home care, counseling, and referral. There is a daycare. Native court worker services are provided out of Whitehorse.

Community Justice

The Southern Lakes Justice Committee offers an alternative to existing justice-related services. Its volunteer members and one employee run a variety of restorative justice programs that provide both victims and offenders different options within the existing criminal justice system.

Police/ Fire

Policing is provided by the RCMP detachment, staffed by a corporal and two constables, with secretarial support. Probation services are provided out of Whitehorse. The Carcross fire department has a chief and 10 volunteer firefighters. Tagish has its own volunteer fire department.

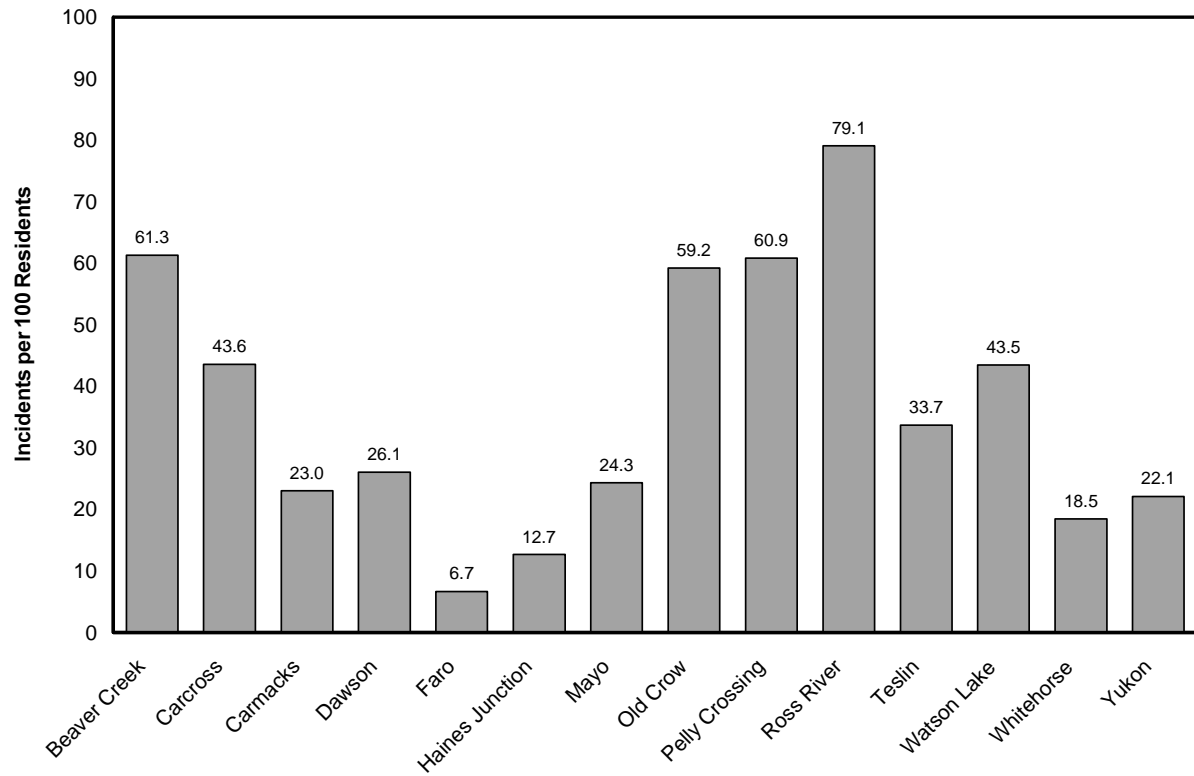
