Background

The present location of the Teslin Indian village was a traditional summer campsite. Tlingit people came over from the Alaskan coast into Teslin, Carcross and Atlin B.C. and had some influence in the Tahltan area of B.C. The original Tlingits traveled from Juneau, Alaska along the Taku River basin in search of fur to trade with the Russian traders of Alaska. Some of the Tlingits settled in the Teslin area at Nisutlin Bay around the Taylor and Drury trading post site.

After the Alaska Highway was built in 1942, the community of Teslin became more permanent. The Tlingit tradition and culture, brought over from the coastal region, is strongly practiced and taught today by the Teslin Tlingit Council citizens. This tradition influenced the change in the structure of the First Nation government and elections.

Teslin Tlingit Council citizens live mainly in the southwest section of the village of Teslin, although the population has expanded into the Fox Point area with the arrival of Bill C-31 members. The Teslin community has a resident population of 478, according to 1997 population figures.

Land Claims and Self Government

The Teslin Tlingit Council completed negotiations with the Governments of Canada and the Yukon of its Final Land Claim and Self-Government Agreements in November of 1992.

Health Care

Health care is provided through the community health centre, which offers daily service and is staffed by two resident nurses. A physician visits monthly. The health centre also provides 24-hour emergency service.

Social Services

YTG Health and Social Services provides a social worker. Yukon Family Services Association provides itinerant services from Whitehorse. The Teslin Tlingit Council offers social services to its members through a Social Programs team. There is a social administrator, drug and alcohol worker, community health representative, Community Education Liaison Coordinator, and youth worker. Services include social assistance, in-home care, counseling, and referral. Native courtworker services are provided out of Whitehorse.

Police/ Fire

Policing is provided by the RCMP detachment, which is staffed by one corporal, one constable, and one First Nations special constable. Probation officer services are provided out of Whitehorse. The fire department is run by a chief and 12 volunteer firefighters.

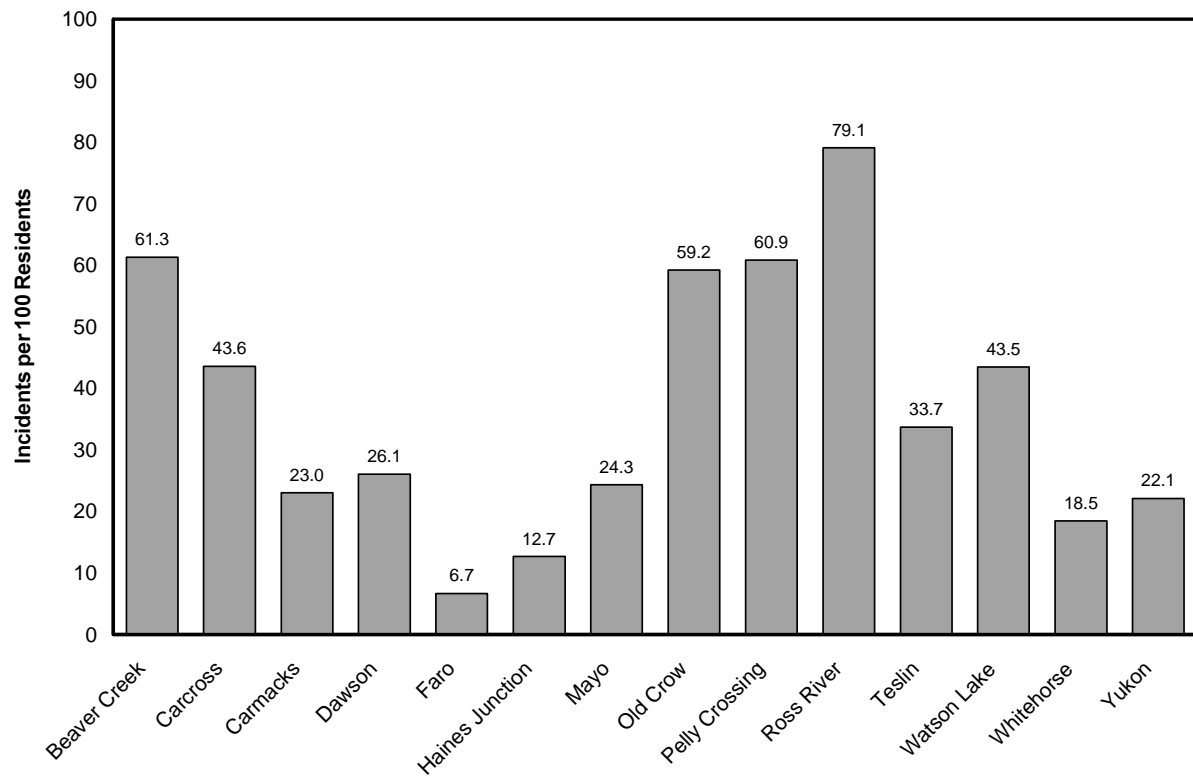
