Highlights:

- In December 2020, the number of active employee-based businesses in Yukon was 1,304; a decrease of 9 businesses, or 0.7%, compared to the revised pre-COVID-19 number in February of 2020 (1,313).
- The number of business closures in December 2020 was 67, compared to 58 in November 2020 (revised) and 71 in December 2019 (revised).

The publication presents monthly <u>experimental estimates</u> by Statistics Canada on the numbers of business openings and closures, continuing and active businesses, and as of this edition, now include reopenings and entrants. The estimated numbers of business openings and closures in this publication, as well as business reopenings and entrants, are based on PD7 remittances (payroll deductions) to Canada Revenue Agency (CRA), and therefore only represent businesses that had or did not have employment during the reference month compared to the previous month.

Notes:

The business counts used are based on establishments within firms to which payroll/employment can be associated in the Survey of Employment Payroll and Hours (SEPH).

- A business closure is defined as a firm that had paid employment in the previous month, but no paid employment in the current month. The closure may be temporary or permanent.
- A business opening is defined as a firm with paid employment in the current month, and no paid employment in the previous month.

As businesses can close and reopen within a year, these experimental estimates on monthly openings and closures capture transitory changes, unlike business entrance and exit that capture permanent changes.

- Reopening businesses are defined as opening businesses that were active in a month in the previous year (i.e., had employees in a month of the previous year and did not have employees in the previous month(s), but had employees in the reference month)
- Entrants are defined as opening businesses that were not on record in the previous year.
- Continuing businesses are those that have employees in both previous and current month and active businesses in any given month is the number of opening and continuing businesses in that month.


 3 = Continuing businesses are businesses that have at least one employee in the previous month and at least one employee in the current month.
- 4 = Closing businesses are businesses that transition from having at least one employee in the previous month to having no employees in the current month. 5 = Reopening businesses are defined as opening businesses that were also active in a previous month.
- 6 = Entrants are opening businesses that were not active in a previous month.
- In Yukon, comparing December 2020 to December 2019 (revised), there were 33, or 2.5%, fewer active businesses (1,304); 5, or 7.4% more business openings (73); 37, or 2.9% fewer continuing businesses 1,236); 4, or 5.6% fewer business closures (67); 6, or 13.6% more reopening businesses (50); and 1, or 4.2% fewer business entrants (23).

- Based on PD7 remittances, the number of active Yukon businesses with employees hit a low of 1,232 in May of 2020 (revised). In December of 2020, the number of active businesses (1,304) increased by 72 compared to May 2020 (1,232); however, the number was 33 less than the revised figure for December 2019 (1,337).
- The Accommodation and Food Services sector had the largest increase in the number of active businesses in December 2020 compared to May 2020, followed by the Construction sector — 23 and 13 more businesses, respectively.
- Comparing year-over-year number of active businesses (December 2020 compared to December 2019), the Real Estate and Rental and Leasing sector had the largest decrease at 13 businesses, followed by Other Services (except Public Administration) at 11 businesses.
- The number of active businesses in December 2020 (1,304) increased by 5 compared to the revised November 2020 figure (1,299).




Active Businesses with Employees, by TOURISM Industry, Yukon, December 2019 and February to December 2020

Tourism is not an official industry under the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS). The tourism industry is comprised of parts of different NAICs industries. The composition of the tourism industry reported here is based on Statistics Canada's Canadian Tourism Satellite Account.




- According to experimental estimates (January 2015 to December 2020) from Statistics Canada (based on PD7 remittances), approximately 15% of all active Yukon businesses with employees were considered Tourism businesses.
- The number of active Tourism industry businesses with employees in Yukon hit a low of 168 (revised) in May of 2020. In December of 2020, the number of active businesses (193) increased by 25 compared to May 2020 (168); however, compared to the revised figure for December 2019 (200), the number of active businesses decreased by 7.
- Both the Accommodation and the Food and beverage services sub-sectors had the largest increase in the number of active businesses (13 businesses) in December 2020 compared to May 2020.




Transportation (tourism)




Recreation and entertainment (tourism)



Business Openings and Closures in the Yukon Business Sector, January 2015 to December 2020, seasonally adjusted


- As per estimates from PD7 remittances, in December 2020, the number of Yukon business openings (73) increased by 7 compared to the revised figure for November 2020 openings (66), and increased by 5 compared to the revised figure for December 2019 openings (68).
- There were 67 business closures in December 2020, compared to 58 in November 2020 (revised), and 71 in December 2019 (revised). Yukon business closures reached a high of 154* in April 2020 (revised) due in large part to the impact of COVID-19.

Business Openings by Entrants and Reopening Businesses, Yukon Business Sector, January 2018 to December 2020, seasonally adjusted



- Business openings are comprised of businesses that have employees in the current month, and include entrants that had no record of employment during the previous year plus reopening businesses that were on record in a previous month.
- In December 2020, the number of Yukon business openings (73) included 23 business entrants and 50 reopening businesses.
- From January 2015 to December 2019, on average, about 23 entrant businesses opened in the Yukon business sector on a monthly basis.
- Following the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, the number of business entrants reached a low of 13 in March and 15 in May of 2020. From June 2020, more new businesses entered the business sector, reaching a high of 31 in October 2020, 138.5% higher than that observed in March 2020.
