Remote sales quick reference sheet: third-party delivery

It is the responsibility of third-party delivery services to:

- read and understand the <u>Cannabis Act</u>, <u>Cannabis Control and Regulation Act</u> and Regulations, including obligations and details not discussed in this brief fact sheet;
- any other relevant legislation; and
- to comply with the standards below when delivering orders containing cannabis on behalf of Yukon-based licensed retailers. Non-compliance may lead to enforcement action.

Who can deliver packages containing cannabis?

 Any person delivering packages on behalf of a cannabis licensed retailer must be 19 years of age or older.

Delivery requirements

- A third-party delivery service must ensure that cannabis is only delivered to a person 19 years of age or older.
- Collect the name and signature of the individual taking delivery of the cannabis.
- Cannabis cannot be delivered to individuals who are under the influence of any substance(s):
 - A delivery person may only hand over cannabis if they believe on reasonable grounds that the purchaser is not intoxicated.
 - We recommend that third-party delivery persons take <u>BARS C training</u>. The training has information on identifying intoxication.

- Orders can be delivered to a home address (including face-to-face post office pick-up if using a PO Box as an address) or post office.
- Orders must not be left at the door or in a mailbox. Undeliverable orders must be returned to the licensed retailer.
- Delivery hours for cannabis packages should align with the licensee's hours of sale as stipulated in their licence.

Transport

• Packages must be transported in a secure manner.

If you have any doubts about compliance with any part of Yukon legislation, or the legislation of any other jurisdiction including the federal *Cannabis Act*, refer to your corporate legal counsel.
