Community Nursing

Health centres

Yukon HealthLine provides 24-hour service to Yukoners. It provides health advice and can connect individuals to an appropriate level of medical support. This service also provides poison control information.

Community Health Programs

Sexualized Assault Response Team (SART)

SART is a safe network of agencies that offer medical, legal and victim support services related to sexualized assault in the Yukon. SART services can be accessed by victims of any age, gender, and sexual orientation of both recent and historical sexualized assaults, family members and loved ones supporting a victim, as well as support workers and other professionals...

Yukon Children's Dental Program

This is a school-based public dental program that provides diagnostic, preventative and restorative services to Yukon children. Clinicians provide dental services to both urban and rural communities.

Immunization Program

This program provides routine immunizations to infants, pre-kindergarten children and youth in grades 6 and 9. Children up until the age of 18 are eligible to receive these publicly-funded immunizations for free at local health centres. Pharmacists can also provide certain vaccines such as influenza and HPV to children age 5 and older.

Hearing Services

Hearing Services offers hearing tests and auditory processing screenings, as well as the prescription, dispensing, fitting and maintenance of assistive listening devices. This service also provides audiological recommendations and counselling to parents. Parents/guardians may self-refer their children to Hearing Services.

Yukon Communicable Disease Control (YCDC)

YCDC provides services for communicable diseases like tuberculosis and sexually transmitted infections (STIs) to youth. This includes screening, treatment and discussions on birth control.

Child, Youth and Family Treatment Team

This team offers counselling services, outreach services and youth intensive treatment to help school-aged children, youth and families. Referrals can come from schools, medical offices, other community organizations or self-referrals. Services are available for all Yukoners, with counselling and outreach in communities provided by the Mental Wellness hubs.

Family Resource Unit

The Family Resource Unit offers a universal, low-barrier program for all Yukoners with children under 19 years of age.
